New Stanislaus County Librarian Starts in June

The welcome mat is out for our new county librarian, Diane McDonnell, who will take the reins of Stanislaus County's 13 libraries beginning June 9th. She succeeds Vanessa Czopek who retired in March after more than 18 years serving the Stanislaus County Library.

McDonnell who began her library career as a clerk in Placer County and worked her way up to the Administrative Services Officer there received her Master's of Library and Information Science Degree from San Jose State University in 2012. She is currently a Senior Community Library Manager for the Contra Costa Library.

Ms. McDonnell's biography states that her "library service philosophy is strongly aligned with a proactive, customer-focused service delivery. She believes customers should have self-serve options, and have access to community desired services. In addition, Diane recognizes that a committed, caring, and flexible staff is a library's greatest asset."

She also has extensive experience partnering with advocacy groups like the Friends of the Library and the Library Foundation. After relocating to the Moraga Branch of the Contra Costa Library, the *Lamorinda Patch Newsletter* reported that Ms. McDonnell looked forward to working closely with these library advocates. We, too, look forward to establishing such a partnership with her.

We hope that our new librarian, like Goldilocks, finds our library not too big or too small, but one that is "just right"!

Mayor's Book Club presents Pat Paul

Our enthusiastic mayor, Pat Paul, has been the core for the Mayor's Book Club in Oakdale.
