The Oakdale Library will offer free programs for children and adults this June, beginning with free Computer Basics classes for adults on June 16, 23 and 30 at 10:30 a.m. Participants will receive a tour of Windows, as well as an introduction to the various parts of a computer, and more. Children and their families can build LEGO displays for the library on Thursday, June 11 at 3:30 p.m. Children under the age of 4 are welcome to participate, however they must have direct parental supervision at all times.

Toddlers and preschoolers can enjoy "Wee Move and Play" on Wednesday, June 17 at 3:30 p.m. This program features an hour of music, movement, and sensory play during which children can enjoy unstructured play time with their peers.

Kindergarten through third grade students and their families are invited to "Building STEAM with Día Family Book Club: Build a Structure" on Thursday, June 18 at 3:30 p.m. Following a reading and discussion of *Rosie Revere*, *Engineer* by A. Beaty, children will build a structure out of gumdrops and toothpicks. Refreshments will be served.

On Tuesday, June 23, the Oakdale Library Book Club will offer two opportunities to discuss *Still Alice: A Novel* by Lisa Genova. Participants can choose from the 11:30 a.m. meeting or the 6:30 p.m. meeting. Light refreshments will be provided.

Children are invited to take part in a Superhero Training Academy at the library on June 25 at 3:30 p.m. Those who complete the "official superhero checklist" will receive a special certificate. The challenges include making a superhero mask and cuffs, reading to develop brain power, projectile target practice to develop hand-eye coordination, using your senses to develop X-Ray vision, and disposing of "kryptonite" in order to decontaminate the library. Participants can show off their superhero certificate by posing for a picture in front of the library's superhero backdrop.
