Contest entry forms will be available beginning Saturday, Sept. 1 at all Stanislaus County Libraries and at www.stanislauslibrary.org. Participants are invited to submit an original, anime themed bookmark design to any Stanislaus County Library location for a chance to have their artwork turned into a bookmark. Bookmark entries must be submitted by 5 p.m. on Monday, Oct. 1.

"Not only do the teens like having an opportunity to showcase their work, but all ages enjoy getting a free bookmark at the library that was designed by a talented member of their community."

The winning design will be announced on Anime Day on Saturday, Oct. 20 at the Nick W. Blom Salida Regional Library. Anime Day will take place from 12 to 4 p.m. in the Salida Library Community Room. The contest winner will be announced at 1:30 p.m.
