On Sept. 14 from 2 to 4 p.m. crafters can make anime bookmarks that can then be submitted for the library's Anime Bookmark Contest. Teens can make Pokémon themed origami bookmarks on Sept. 21 from 2 to 5 p.m. Sept. 28 will feature a *Miss Peregrine's Home for Peculiar Children* themed photography craft. Teens can drop by between 2 and 5 p.m. to look at old photographs and try face swapping with them.

In celebration of Roald Dahl's 100th birthday, children can visit the library Sept. 12 through 17 to find the golden ticket hidden in the children's area. Individuals who find the hidden ticket will win a prize.
