Turlock Library to offer free technology programs

All ages are invited to talk tech at the Turlock Library this September

The Turlock Library will focus on technology this September, beginning with a month-long trivia contest designed to test community members' knowledge of technology. All trivia contest entries will be placed in a random drawing to win a prize. The contest is limited to one entry per person, and is open to all ages.

Adults interested in learning the basics of computers can register for free workshops at the library, offered weekly on Thursdays at 3 p.m. The class offers a basic introduction to computers, including an explanation of the parts of the computer, a tour of Windows, and simple tasks. Advance registration is required for all computer classes. Please call 209-664-8100 to sign up.

Individuals interested in learning how to use the library's free eResources will benefit from the Tech Connect program on Monday, Sept. 10 at 12 p.m. Library staff will help participants download and get started using the library's apps, including Cloud Library (eBooks), RBdigital (eMagazines), Hoopla (digital audiobooks, movies, music, eBooks and graphic novels), and Mango Languages, an online language learning program. Participants are asked to bring their library cards and mobile devices or tablets to this event.
